INGHAM COUNTY APPOINTS NEW COUNTY CONTROLLER/ADMINISTRATOR

The Ingham County Board of Commissioners has appointed A. Edwin Dore as its new Controller/Administrator, county officials announced today.

“Ed Dore brings exceptional qualifications back to Ingham County, and we are looking forward to an extremely positive working relationship,” said Board Chairperson Victor Celentino. “His wide range of managerial experiences and issue management knowledge make him an ideal candidate for the Controller/Administrator position.”

Celentino said the county’s selection process was very thorough, with the assistance of Charles Blockett, Jr. and Associates, and commissioners were fortunate to have had five excellent finalists from which to make its selection.

Mr. Dore, formally the chief deputy director of the Michigan Department of Community Health since 2005, will begin serving as the Ingham County Controller/Administrator on June 5, 2006.

Dore rejoins Ingham County government, having served as Deputy Controller and State Policy Analyst from 1981 to 1983. Previously, Dore also served as President of the Ingham Regional Healthcare Foundation from 2002 to 2005, and as Chief Operating Officer and Deputy Secretary of State for the Michigan Department of State from 1986 to 2002 under Republican Candice Miller.

A resident of Haslett, Dore also worked as Deputy Chief Financial Officer and Executive Assistant to the Wayne County Executive from 1983 to 1986. Prior to his work in Ingham County in the early 1980s, Dore served as a senior administrative assistant in the Senate Democratic Majority Office from 1976 to 1981, associate director of the Michigan Municipal League from 1974 to 1976, staff associate to New York Governor Nelson A. Rockefeller from 1973 to 1974, and assistant to the director of the Oakland County Planning Commission from 1971 to 1973.

Dore, 59, holds a Masters of Public Administration from Wayne State University – University of Michigan, and a Bachelors Degree in Public Administration, State, and Local Government from the University of Michigan.
