The meeting was called to order by Chairperson Holman at 6:00 p.m. in the Personnel Conference Room "D & E" of the Human Services Building, 5303 S. Cedar Street, Lansing.

Approval of the May 27, 2010 Minutes

MOVED BY COMM. SCHAFFER, SUPPORTED BY COMM. TSERNOGLOU, TO APPROVE THE MAY 27, 2010 MINUTES AS AMENDED.

The May 27, 2010 Minutes were amended to reflect the following:

Page 2, Item 3, Paragraph 3: The following sentence was added at the end of the paragraph: "The amount listed was calculated by taking 30% of the \$2.6M originally requested from the townships for startup costs."

Limited Public Comment

Ms. Buckland, Jail Medical, expressed her opposition to privatizing Jail Medical.

(Comm. Copedge arrived at 6:03 p.m.)

(Comm. Koenig arrived at 6:06 p.m.)

Mr. Bobo, ICYC, stated that UAW opposes privatizing Jail Medical.

1. Animal Control - Discussion: Eaton County RFP for Animal Shelter Services (*No Materials*)

Mr. Neilsen, Controller's Office, informed the Committee that Ms. Lampman, Animal Control, does not feel that it is worth the County's effort to respond to the RFP from Eaton County.

Chairperson Holman asked if it is possible to collaborate with Eaton County on certain areas of animal shelter services. Mr. Neilsen stated that he will explore that option.

2. Community Corrections Advisory Board
 - a. Update on Resource Utilization (*No Materials*)

Ms. Sabaj, Community Corrections, informed the Committee that they have increased utilization of all community-based resources within the jail setting for early-release options. In regards to the electronic monitoring system, she stated that Community Corrections has collaborated with Sentinel in order to develop strategies for improving numbers. She thanked Chief Deputy Harless for his hard work on this matter. She stated that within the last week, the judges have identified another pre-trial population (those with cash bonds of \$10,000 or less) to be approved for automatic eligibility for tethering.

Comm. Copedge asked how long the contract with Sentinel is. Ms. Sabaj answered that the contract automatically renews annually until November, 2012. She stated that there is a 90-day option to terminate the contract with written notification.

Comm. Koenig asked when the launch date is. Ms. Sabaj answered that it will be July 1, 2010 at the latest.

Comm. Tsernoglou directed Ms. Sabaj to provide the Commissioners with a list of descriptions of alternative options available for the pre-trial population.

Ms. Sabaj indicated that since April 1, 2010 residential bed usage has increased by 35%. She stated that there has been a significant improvement in communication from the probation agents.

- b. Resolution Authorizing Submission of a Grant Application and Entering into a Contract with the Michigan Department of Corrections for Ingham County/City of Lansing Community Corrections and Authorizing Entering into Subcontracts for Community Corrections Programs for FY 2010-2011

MOVED BY COMM. CELENTINO, SUPPORTED BY COMM. SCHAFFER, TO APPROVE THE RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING SUBMISSION OF A GRANT APPLICATION AND ENTERING INTO A CONTRACT WITH THE MICHIGAN DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS FOR INGHAM COUNTY/CITY OF LANSING COMMUNITY CORRECTIONS AND AUTHORIZING ENTERING INTO SUBCONTRACTS FOR COMMUNITY CORRECTIONS PROGRAMS FOR FY 2010-2011.

MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

Ms. Sabaj informed the Committee that Dr. Van Nostrand from Luminosity is scheduled to visit June 28-30. She has scheduled interviews on Monday and Tuesday with all relevant Criminal Justice departments and agencies. Her final presentation of recommendations will be made Wednesday, June 30th, 12:30-2:30 p.m.

Comm. Tsernoglou directed Mr. Neilsen to email all the Commissioners Dr. Van Nostrand's itinerary for the week of the site visit.

3. Sheriff's Office/Health Department - Discussion on Preparing an RFP for Jail Medical Services

Mr. Spyke, Sheriff's Office, informed the Committee that the Sheriff's Department has been contacted on numerous occasions by private contractors claiming that they can provide Jail Medical services at a significantly lower cost. He indicated that the Sheriff's Department is requesting approval for sending out an RFP.

Comm. Tsernoglou asked how the Health Department feels about this. Dr. Sienko, Health Department, indicated that they are taking a neutral position. He stated that their analysis suggests that there won't be significant cost savings, but they are not standing in the way of an RFP going out.

Mr. Spyke stated that even if the Board of Commissioners rejects all the RFP's, the Sheriff's Department will still acquire useful information that can be used to improve the system.

Comm. Schafer expressed his concern of an abundance of inmates going to the hospital. He asked if there is nursing staff available at all times. Mr. Spyke stated that there are times when medical staff is not present, and the deputies are required to make an assessment. Mr. Harless indicated that for the on-call process, if an inmate takes ill and needs medical care, they have the option to either call the EMS immediately or call the on-call doctor. Ms. Brinson, Health Department, stated that the on-call process that occurs during the 13% of the time when medical staff is not there should be reviewed.

Mr. Harless indicated that Monday-Friday, 7am-4pm, there is 1 RN and 1 LPN; 8am-5pm there is 1 Nurse Practitioner; 2:30-11:30 pm there are 2 Nurses; 10:30pm-7am there is 1 Nurse; and 8am-5pm there are 2 Clinical Assistants. He stated that on Saturdays and Sundays there is 1 RN 11:30am-12am. He indicated that the after hours on-call coverage is provided by a Physician or Nurse Practitioner.

Comm. Celentino expressed his concern that privatizing Jail Medical could result in nursing staff losing their positions. Mr. Spyke stated that an RFP could be drafted to include retaining present staff within their collective bargaining units. Comm. Copedge expressed his opposition to privatizing Jail Medical. Comm. Schafer echoed Comm. Copedge's remarks.

Ms. Brinson indicated that the Health Department will work with the Sheriff's Department to make improvements to the Jail Medical services.

(Comm. Celentino and Comm. Koenig left at 7:13 p.m.)

4. Sheriff's Office: Discussion on Inmate Billing System

Comm. Schafer stated that it is important that the Board of Commissioners revisit discussions of the inmate billing system. He indicated that there needs to be more follow-up on inmates, going beyond asking if they own a car, have a job, W-2 forms, etc. He stated that they may still have other sources of income even though claiming to be indigent.

WHEREAS, Sergeant Brian Valentine graduated from Lansing Community College in 1984; and

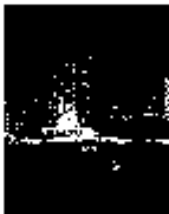

Summary of Proposed Action: This resolution requests the Jail Utilization Coordinating Committee (JUCC) to evaluate the Luminosity Solutions report and other strategies to responsibly manage the jail population while maintaining public safety and the integrity of the judicial process. The Board of Commissioners approved a contract with Luminosity Solutions for the purpose of reviewing certain aspects of the Ingham County Criminal Justice System and providing recommendations to responsibly manage the reduced jail population in order to deal with the closing of a Post at the Jail which will reduce the jail Population by 64 beds (Post 3).

Financial Implications: The JUCC is requested to report back their findings and recommendations by September 1, 2010, prior to the Law Enforcement and Judiciary Committee Budget Hearings in order to have any financial recommendations considered within the schedule of the 2011 budget process.

Other Implications: The Luminosity Solutions report "Jail and Justice System Assessment" has been distributed under separate cover to the Board of Commissioners and to a broad spectrum of the judiciary and other Ingham County Criminal Justice agencies.

RESOLUTION FROM THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS REQUESTING THAT THE JAIL UTILIZATION COORDINATING COMMITTEE (JUCC) EVALUATE THE LUMINOSITY SOLUTIONS REPORT AND OTHER STRATEGIES TO RESPONSIBLY MANAGE THE JAIL POPULATION WHILE MAINTAINING PUBLIC SAFETY AND THE INTEGRITY OF THE JUDICIAL PROCESS

WHEREAS, the Ingham County Board of Commissioners has directed the County Controller/Administrator to plan for the Closure of a Jail Post by January 1, 2011, which will effectively reduce the Jail's population for local use from 472 inmates to 408; and

WHEREAS, in order to plan for the reduced Jail beds in a orderly and collaborative manner, the Board of Commissioners contracted with a nationally known consultant Luminosity Solutions for the purpose of reviewing certain aspects of the Ingham County Criminal Justice System and providing recommendations to responsibly manage the jail population while maintaining public safety and the integrity of the judicial process; and

WHEREAS, the Jail Utilization Coordinating Committee (JUCC) is comprised of representatives of the criminal justice stakeholders who cooperate on the utilization of the finite resource of Ingham County Jail beds, such as the Circuit Court, the District Courts, the Prosecutor's Office, the Sheriff's Department, Community Corrections, and others that developed the Jail Population Management Plan and other policies related to Jail utilization; and

WHEREAS, the Ingham County Board of Commissioners has previously established the following area of priority in developing the 2011 County Budget:

Providing Appropriate Sanctions for Adult Offenders

Encourage the use of appropriate sanctions for adults in order to foster appropriate behavior and reduce criminal recidivism, and to reduce incidents of jail overcrowding, using strategies such as supporting implementation of recommendations of the Jail Overcrowding Subcommittee and Community Corrections Advisory Board as well as working with community partners such as Mid-South Substance Abuse Commission to facilitate treatment of substance abuse disorders, develop and use a data tracking system focusing on system volume and trends, supporting appropriate usage of existing probation residential services, to increase the usage of GPS/tethering equipment, and using improved information collection, automation, record keeping, and information exchange between departments. This information will be used to help improve jail utilization.

Specific enhancement: In light of the current budget situation, including the closing a jail post as part of the 2011 budget, support efforts to increase access to program alternatives available through Community Corrections, utilizing state funds. Consider county financial support to implement the recommendations of the Community Corrections Advisory Board and Jail Utilization Coordinating Committee, increased use of the existing range of appropriate community-based direct and contractual treatment and service programs, including electronic monitoring, residential beds, and other alternative sentencing options, as well as implementing system enhancements in jail-related programs, such as pre-trial services and jail population management.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Ingham County Board of Commissioners hereby requests that the Jail Utilization Coordinating Committee (JUCC) evaluate the Luminosity Solutions Report “Jail and Justice System Assessment” specifically, the Primary and Secondary recommendations within the report for the possibility of adoption in Ingham County.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Ingham County Board of Commissioners hereby requests that the JUCC also consider the development of possible new strategies and evaluate current strategies designed to reduce incidents of Jail Overcrowding including the effectiveness of the current Jail Population Management Plan, and using methods such as working with community partners such as Mid-South Substance Abuse Commission to facilitate treatment of substance abuse disorders, developing and utilizing a data tracking system focusing on system volume and trends, supporting appropriate usage of existing probation residential services, increasing the usage of GPS/tethering equipment, and using improved information collection, automation, record keeping, and information exchange between departments to help improve jail utilization.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the JUCC is requested to report back their findings in the form of recommendations along with a proposed implementation plan by September 1, 2010 prior to the Law Enforcement and Judiciary Committee Budget Hearings.

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the Governor's proposed FY 10-11 budget includes moving \$2.6 million from the Sheriff's Secondary Road Patrol fund to the Michigan State Police budget to fund troopers and radios (\$2.2 for troopers - \$400,000 MPSCS radio); and

WHEREAS, it is estimated that this action could cause the layoff of a Lenawee County officer, and in all likelihood, the impact may affect up to 167 officers statewide; and

WHEREAS, the Secondary Road Patrol is funded by a \$10.00 assessment on all moving traffic violations and, since 2003, no General Fund contribution has been included in its funding; and

WHEREAS, the Michigan State Police, through enabling legislation, receive a like assessment of \$10.00 for trooper funding; and

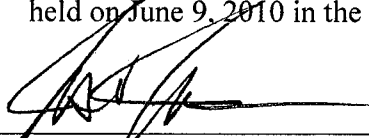
WHEREAS, the Secondary Road Patrol is a successful program spanning 30 years and is monitored for compliance with provisions of PA 416 by the Office of Highway Safety Planning which has stated in the 2008 Secondary Road Patrol Annual Report that "OHSP believes the Secondary Road Patrol Program has played a significant role in Michigan's traffic safety picture and that having a visible law enforcement presence on secondary roads has had a positive impact on driver behavior"; and

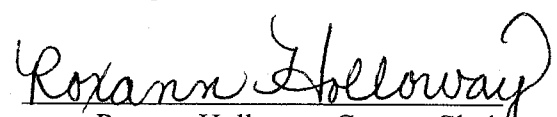
WHEREAS, should this proposal be implemented, it will require the 416 Act to be opened and amended, at which time the fund could be further depleted by additional amendments for various other "worthy" causes.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Lenawee County Board of Commissioners goes on record opposing the proposal to move \$2.6 million from the Sheriff's Secondary Road Patrol fund to the Michigan State Police budget to fund troopers and radios; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this resolution be forwarded to Governor Granholm, our State Legislators, the Michigan Association of Counties and the other 82 Michigan counties.
